

Legacy Scholarship Award Information

Legacy Awards are \$4,000 scholarships available to children and grandchildren of Elks members. Eligibility requirements are outlined below.


The 2023 contest and application opens on September 1, 2022 and is an online application process on the Elks.org website under Scholarships. Deadline to apply is February 6, 2023.

Who is Eligible?

1. For the 2023 contest, any child or grandchild (or step-child, step-grandchild, or legal ward) of a living Elk who joined the order on or before April 1, 2020, or a charter member of a Lodge that was instituted on or after April 1, 2020, is eligible to apply. The Elk must also be a paid-up member through March 31, 2023. Great-grandchildren are not eligible.
2. The applicant must be a high school senior.
3. The applicant must apply online only. The 2023 Legacy Awards application deadline is February 6, 2023, 11:59 pm Pacific Time.
4. If the applicant's parent and grandparent are both Elk members, the applicant must apply through the parent's Elks Lodge.
5. Students may apply for more than one ENF scholarship; however, they may win only one. In cases where the student wins more than one, we will award the scholarship with the greater value. Students can accept local and state scholarships, which are separate from the awards at the national level.
6. Legacy Awards may only be applied to accredited US American schools, colleges or universities.
7. If you are selected as a 2023 Legacy Awards recipient, you will be required to perform three instances of service with an Elks Lodge during the four years you are receiving the scholarship.

Elks Scholarship Information by Donna Grey

Welcome back to school! It seems like just yesterday when we wrapped up the 2021-2022 scholarships and awards from the National Elks Foundation and Newport Elks Lodge #273.

Yet, the **2023 Scholarship Season Began on Monday, August 1.**

MOST VALUABLE STUDENT SCHOLARSHIPS: As a reminder, we start with the Most Valuable Student Scholarship, which is open to all high school seniors who are U.S. citizens. From all of the applications judged by the Newport Elks Lodge, the top three males and top three females will advance to the next level of judging. From all of the applications that are advanced to the state level of judging, the National Elks Foundation will award 500, four-year scholarships based on academics, service, leadership and financial need. Each of the top 20 finalists will receive scholarships of at least \$20,000; and finalists will be invited to the Leadership Weekend to compete for six top awards—two each at \$30,000, \$40,000 and \$50,000. The 480 runners-up will receive \$4,000 scholarships. (We did not have any state winners last year.)

Most Valuable Student - Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks

The 2023 application opened on August 1. Applicants will be judged on scholarship, leadership, and financial need. Eligibility: Current high school seniors, or the equivalent, who are citizens of the United States are eligible to apply.

In addition, your local Newport Elks Lodge #273 will be awarding \$500-\$1,000 to top students in each of the high schools in Campbell County based on highest scores in academics, service, leadership and financial need (for each school).

Deadline for students to apply online is November 14, 2022. Counselors play a role having to complete the guidance counselor report for each student applying.

Bubbie's Hearty Matzo Ball Soup (All Recipes.com)

Ingredients

- 1 (3 pound) whole chicken
 - 2 (48 ounce) containers chicken broth
 - 4 large carrots, cut into 1/4-inch dice
 - 4 stalks celery, cut into 1/4-inch dice
 - 1 large turnip, cut into 1/4-inch dice
 - 2 parsnips, cut into 1/4-inch dice
 - 1 leek, chopped
 - 1 onion, cut into 1/4-inch dice
 - ½ cup chopped fresh dill
 - 1 ½ cups matzo ball mix
 - 4 eggs
 - ⅓ cup vegetable oil
 - ½ cup water
- 1 pinch salt and ground black pepper to taste



Directions

Instructions Checklist

Step 1

Place chicken into a large pot and cover with water; bring to a boil. Reduce heat to low and simmer until chicken meat is very tender and falling off the bones, about 1 1/2 hours. Remove chicken from pot and pick chicken meat from bones when cool enough to handle, discarding skin and bones. Shred chicken meat.

Step 2

Bring chicken broth to a boil in a large soup pot; stir shredded chicken meat, carrots, celery, turnip, parsnips, leek, onion, and dill into broth. Turn heat to low and simmer until vegetables are tender, about 20 minutes.

Step 3

Stir matzo ball mix, eggs, vegetable oil, and 1/2 cup water together in a bowl. Form mixture into 1-inch balls using wet hands to prevent sticking. Return broth to a boil and gently drop matzo balls into the boiling soup. Reduce heat again and simmer soup until matzo balls have increased in size and are cooked through, about 20 more minutes.

Cook's Note:

You may adjust the amount of vegetables to create a soup that is more or less hearty. The soup is very flavorful as is and always tastes better the next day. Also, if you love dill, you may consider adding some to the matzo meal before forming the balls.



How to Cook Chinese Fried Rice , Marion's Fried Rice

Serves: 4

Ingredients

2 tbsp Chinese light soy sauce

2 tbsp Chinese shaoxing cooking wine

1 tsp white sugar

2 tbsp vegetable oil

4 garlic cloves, roughly chopped

1 small onion,

diced 200g (7oz) diced Homemade Chinese 'Char Siu' BBQ Pork (you can also use char siu bought from a restaurant or simply substitute sliced pork, chicken or seafood)

2 eggs, lightly whisked

3 cups (450g/1lb) cooked jasmine or long grain rice (preferably made the day before)

1 tsp sea salt

¼ cup finely sliced spring onion (scallions)

1 tbsp sesame oil

¼ tsp ground white pepper

Instructions

STEP 1 Make the fried rice stir-fry sauce by mixing the soy sauce, shaoxing wine and sugar.

STEP 2 Prepare, measure and chop all ingredients before cooking.

STEP 3 Heat the vegetable oil in a wok or large frying pan over medium heat. Add the garlic and cook, stirring, until just starting to turn golden. Add the onion and stir-fry for another 30 seconds or until the onion is just softened. Add the char siu pork and stir-fry for another 30 seconds until warmed through.

STEP 4 Push all the ingredients over to one side of the pan or wok. Tilt the pan so that the oil slides into the empty side.

Pour the eggs into the oil. Use a spatula to spread the egg out so it cooks evenly. Once the egg is set, break it up and mix with other ingredients.

Add the rice and break up and incorporate the rice with the other ingredients.

Add the soy sauce mixture and stir-fry until well combined. Toss through the sea salt and spring onion. Turn the heat off and toss through the sesame oil and white pepper. Serve warm.
