
The Soccer Shoot will be on




SECRETARY'S CORNER





Newport Elks 273 3rd Annual Kids with Cancer Car and Bike Show

Jim and Candy Staubach hosted our 3rd Annual Kids with Cancer Car and Bike Show. It was a great day to have a car show and we were able to raise \$1,446 for Kids with Cancer through entry fees, food and raffles. The Mayor of Cold Spring was our guest judge. We awarded 5 trophies to our winners that included Best Modern, Classic, Motorcycle and Mayor Choice.



Newport Elks 273 Scholarship Committee

The Newport Elks Scholarship Committee (*Ray Pauly, Cathi Hildebrand and Donna Hanson*) had a very busy year with 28 applications received for the Most Valuable Student Scholarship Program and 35 applications received for the Newport Elks College Aid Grant Program. The Committee selected the top nine Most Valuable Students to receive local awards of \$1,000 each and eight students received College Aid Grants between \$500 and \$1,000 each for a total of \$16,000 in funding for graduating high school seniors in 2025. The Newport Elks Lodge is also very proud that four of the five students from Kentucky to receive Legacy Awards were sponsored by the Newport Elks Lodge.



Newport Elks 273 Breakfast with the Easter Bunny

On April 5th we had Breakfast with the Easter Bunny and Drug Awareness Event. There were over 100 people registered and quite a few walk-ins, thanks to the rain. With funds from the Freedom Grant, we were able to purchase the washer/dryer combo that helped to complete this unit.


Newport Elks Spotlight Grant with the Ladies Auxiliary


