Thank you to the following members for representing the lodge at the Kentucky Department of Charitable


Gaming Training on August 3, 2024. Terry Amiott, Dave Zion, Lorraine Haverkamp and Season Lawrence.



THE BEST HOMEMADE LASAGNA

Delicious homemade lasagna that's easy to assemble and has so much flavor!

Ingredients

- · 2 pounds lean ground beef
- · 1 medium yellow onion diced
- · 2 cloves garlic minced
- ½ teaspoon garlic salt
- ½ teaspoon oregano
- · 1-2 Tbs dried parsley flakes
- · 32 oz favorite Spaghetti sauce
- · ½ cup water/cornstarch slurry, pour that into the spaghetti sauce after it's mixed.
- · 6-9 lasagna noodles cooked
- 22 oz small curd cottage cheese
- · 2 eggs beaten
- · 1 teaspoon salt
- · ½ cup Parmesan shredded
- 16 oz shredded Mozzarella

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees Fahrenheit. Grease a 9x13 inch baking dish and set aside.
- 2. In a large skillet brown the hamburger of over medium heat. Drain off any excess grease.
- 3. Add the onion, garlic, 1 Tbsp parsley flakes,

garlic salt, oregano, add the spaghetti sauce to the skillet and simmer 30 minutes, at the end of 30 min pour cornstarch slurry in and stir.

- 4. Meanwhile in a large bowl combine cottage cheese, eggs, salt, 1 Tbsp parsley flakes and Parmesan cheese.
- 5. When the meat mixture is done simmering spread ½ c. of hamburger mixture on the bottom of prepared pan. Place three prepared lasagna noodles side by side on top of meat mixture so they don't overlap. Cover with the meat mixture, cover that with the cottage cheese mixture then cover that with Mozzarella cheese. Repeat layers, topping with layer of meat mixture, except leave off the Mozzarella cheese.
- 6. Bake for 45-60 minutes in the preheated oven at 350 degrees Fahrenheit.
- 7. Remove from oven and top with remaining Mozzarella cheese covering the sauce top.
- 8. Bake 10 more minutes or until cheese is melted.
- 9. Remove from oven and let stand for 10-15 minutes before serving.




