
tion. We need more participation by our members for these functions to support our lodge. We also need to have more member participation in our bi-weekly lodge meetings.



We also purchased emergency needs for Ft. Thomas which included: shampoo, body wash, shaving cream and denture supplies.




If anyone would like to come up and help with the Veterans, we meet every 4th Tuesday of the month.




